


On December 4, 1962, The American Society of Dermatopathology (ASDP) holds its first official business meeting and approves the Constitution and Bylaws. Hamilton Montgomery, MD, is elected President, Hermann Pinkus, MD, becomes President-Elect and Walter R. Nickel, MD, is elected Secretary-Treasurer.


ASDP's net worth reaches \$1,090. Membership reaches 58 charter members, including 12 founding members.

ASDP joins the Intersociety Pathology Council (IPC).



ASDP's net worth reaches \$7,700. Membership exceeds 200 and membership dues are \$10 with a special assessment of \$10. Thirty-three abstracts are submitted for presentation at the 10th Annual Meeting.

In spite of all these opportunities for study of dermatopathology, there has been a long-felt need for a forum to ally general pathologists interested in advancing and teaching dermatopathology with dermatologists of the same inclination.

ASDP committees on Peer Review and Laboratory Proficiency Testing, Accreditation



and Quality Assurance are added to the Society's roster of standing committees.

ASDP holds its first two-day annual meeting at the Hotel Del Coronado in California and becomes accredited by the AMA to provide continuing medical education. It's at this meeting that the first Self-Assessment Course is held under the direction of Walter R. Nickel, MD.

ASDP's Quality Control, Proficiency Testing and Laboratory Inspection program is launched under the directorship of James H. Graham, MD, and George Ioannides, MD.

The first jointly sponsored IAP/ASDP dermatopathology session is held at the International Congress of Pathology.




ASDP becomes an accredited provider of AAD CME for its annual meetings.








ASDP becomes a member of the International League of Dermatologic Societies (ILDS).










ASDP revises its original logo.







ASDP's net worth reaches \$294,713. Membership reaches 900. Two hundredfour abstracts are submitted for presentation at the 30th Annual Meeting.












ASDP finds permanent headquarters when it contracts professional association management services with Dermatology Services Inc., a subsidiary of the American Academy of Dermatology (AAD).




is moved to Yale University, and subsequently to the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, as efforts to digitize and preserve the entire glass slide collection begin.

ASDP holds its Annual Meeting virtually for the first time, November 5-11, 2020, because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The meeting is also entirely virtual the next year.





On July 15, 2021, ASDP launches the Society Scope, the official newsletter of the Society.



2022 —

ASDP turns 60! Net worth reaches \$3.3 million. Membership reaches 1,346 and membership dues are \$480. Four hundred forty-six abstracts are submitted for presentation at the 59th Annual Meeting.

On June 29, 2022, ASDP holds its first Fellowship Forum Webinar for residents interested in dermatopathology fellowship.

ASDP holds its first hybrid meeting, the 59th Annual Meeting, October 20-23, 2022, with options of in-person and online-only attendance, and online-only optional programming.

In November 2022, ASDP releases the ASDP Dermpath AUC app, with appropriate use criteria developed by the ASDP AUC Committee, supporting a systematic approach to the use of ancillary tests for multiple conditions evaluated in dermatopathology. 1,346 members
